Year 2 Curriculum Map – Spring Term 1



Literacy

This term we will be reading this fantastic book called *The Tin Forest* by Helen Ward. It is about an old man who lives in a place filled with rubbish. As he dreams of a better place to live, he comes up with the idea to turn the rubbish into something beautiful.

Writing outcomes:

- Write a description of a forest setting.
- Write instructions on how to plant a seed.
- Write an information leaflet.



Maths

We will continue our work in maths, following our Maths Mastery units of learning. This term the children will be learning:

Time

Tell the time on an analogue clock; quarter past, quarter to and 5 minute intervals. Calculate durations of time in minutes and seconds.

Know the minutes in an hour and hours in a day.

Fractions

Fractions as part of a whole, or a whole set. Fractions related to division. Equivalent fractions.

Addition and Subtraction of two-digit numbers

Illustrate, represent and explain addition and subtraction involving regrouping.

Science - Everyday materials

- To know that some materials are natural and some are man-made.
- To know why different materials are used for different purposes.
- To understand that some materials can be twisted, squashed or bent according to need.
- To know that some materials can be recycled and that plastic is nonbiodegradable.
- To know about important people who have developed materials.
- To find out which materials are good for making tea bags.

- To know about the Jewish festival of Hanukkah.
- To know some of the symbols that are important to Jewish people.
